- 13. Using Holi colours/bursting crackers.
- 14. Carrying money in excess of the amount permitted by the school:

Upto Grade II No money allowed III-V Rs 30 VI-VIII Rs 50

If a student is carrying money in excess of the prescribed amount for purchasing something from book shop, it should be intimated to the class teacher otherwise disciplinary action will be taken.

Retribution Card: In order to maintain discipline, the system of retribution cards is followed in the school. The card is issued to the student in the presence of the parent. Any of the above mentioned misbehavior/gross indiscipline can lead to the student being given a retribution card.

School Rules



- It is mandatory for all the students to bring the Almanac to school everyday.
- 2. The student should affix his/her photograph and fill in the required information ,duly signed by the parents, in the space provided for in the Almanac.
- Students must wear their school I-Cards during school hours.
- 4. Students who come to school by their own conveyance should reach school five minutes before the bell rings.
- 5. The ringing of the bell in the morning is a signal for students to assemble immediately in perfect silence. As soon as they get back to their classes, they should get their books ready for the first period.
- 6. The school uniform, only in prescribed school colour, should be immaculate, clean and smart, and should be worn on all working days, school functions and PTM's. In winters, school jacket is compulsory. Action will be taken against students who are habitually improperly dressed.
- 7. Boys should have neatly trimmed hair and girls should either cut their hair short/neatly tie in plaits. The hemline of the skirt worn by the girl student should touch the knee.
- 8. Name, class, section and admission number must be clearly marked on all the belongings of students.
- Special care must be taken of all school property. Do not litter and use the garbage bins. Do not scratch or spoil the desks, chairs and charts or damage school furniture. Do not write or draw anything on the walls or damage things / belongings of others.
- 10. Damage or breakage done even accidently should be reported to the class teacher. The students will be required to pay for any damage to school property. The school reserves the right to suspend/expel students whose conduct is harmful to other students or to the school.

- 11. The school strictly prohibits any public display of affection. Appropriate action will be taken in case of any violation of the same. Display of violence in any form inside or outside the school is strictly prohibited
- 12. Students are not allowed to use the school telephone without the permission of the Principal. They will not be called to answer phone calls during school hours.
- 13. Students are not permitted to leave the school premises during the school hours without prior permission of the Principal or the Academic Co-ordinators.
- 14. Students must move in an orderly manner while they are moving from one place to another in the school premises.
- 15. Students are not allowed to bring personal sports equipments to school.
- 16. Students are not allowed to carry mobile phones inside the school premises. If a student brings a mobile phone to school, it will be confiscated for the rest of the session and a heavy fine will be imposed.
- 17. School will not support any private party inside or outside the school premises.
- 18. Birthday celebrations are not encouraged in the school. Parents are requested not to send any cakes/ return gifts to school. Only chocolates/sweets worth not more than Rs. 20/- can be sent for distribution.
- 19. Students are allowed to use school canteen during break time only and they are not permitted to buy eatables from vendors outside the school premises.
- 20. Misbehaviour inside the school premises or in the school conveyance may also lead to disciplinary action against the concerned students. Objectionable behaviour, discourtesy and disrespect to the teachers, disobedience and irregular attendance will also lead to strict disciplinary action.
- 21. No student is allowed to come to school in self driven vehicle. Refer to CBSE circular no. DE.23(555)/Sch. Br./2014/1900 Dated 3/11/16

School Rules

- 22. KRM students should observe polite standards wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct. They should greet their teachers when they meet them. Bullying and use of foul language is prohibited and punishable as per school rules.
- 23. Any student found using unfair means during tests will be given zero in the subject. Repetition of the same will result in suspension/expulsion from the school.
- 24. The medium of conversation in the school premises should be strictly English.
- 25. Parents who make independent transport arrangements for their ward by hiring vans/rickshaws etc. will be fully responsible for the same. They must ensure that proper verification of drivers, rickshaw pullers is done and all safety measures have been taken to avoid any untoward incident
- 26. A student is marked absent for the day, if his/her parent does not attend the scheduled PTM.
- A Fine of Rs. 2000 will be levied on any student found tampering/ destroying the CCTV cameras installed in the school premises.

Transport Rules

1. An optional transport facility is made available to the students. Students can avail the school transport subject to availability of seats from any particular area. In case, the school transport is not available, the parents will have to make their own arrangements. Chartered bus routes by the school will not change and any request for the same will not be entertained. Transport fee is levied keeping the budget and all overhead expenses in view and is at the sole discretion of the management.

- Mid session withdrawl from use of transport will be permitted only against one month written notice to the transport in-charge or payment of one month fee in lieu thereof.
 - However, students will not be permitted to discontinue the school bus usage in the last quarter of the session.
- 3. It is mandatory for all parents who wish their ward to discontinue the usage of school transport to deposit a Bus Security Refund Form.
- 4. No student will be allowed to travel by school bus without his/her Identity card. He/she must be in proper school uniform.
- 5. The bus drivers are authorized to stop the bus only at the designated stops. The bus will not wait for late comers. Parents/Guardians must carry school I-Cards.
- 6. Students are expected to:
- Behave in a courteous manner. They will be penalized for unruly behaviour or damages caused due to negligence and vandalism.
- b) Avoid throwing any trash/food inside or outside the bus.
- c) Be seated when the bus is in motion. No student is allowed to stand on the footboard.
- d) Follow the instructions of the teacher in-charge. He/she has the authority to report any offence to the Principal immediately.

- Rubrics for assessment of all subjects are framed by the respective teachers as per the assessment objectives laid by CBSE & NCERT. Each component of the rubric is assessed by awarding marks on different skills developed during the teaching-learning process. The components are as follows:-
- Observations: All students will be observed regularly with a focus on the individual, the group and the whole class, on punctuality, interest, attentiveness, student's self- reflection, self and peer assessment etc.
- Research: Students will be presented with tasks that represent challenges, risk etc. These include performance in Monday tests, recalling session, homework, reports, essay etc. Inter-disciplinary Skills: (research, thinking, communication, self-management): The focus is on the process and skill application rather than on the product.

- Learner Profile Attributes: The development of learner profile attributes during the teaching learning process will be assessed. Open-Ended questions: Students will be presented with a challenge and asked to provide an original response in class room discussions. Tests/Quizzes: These are aimed at providing a snapshot of students' specific knowledge that he/she acquires
- Portfolios and Goal Setting: Students will be expected to maintain a file consisting of records of special work produced by them during each session and reflections on what they have achieved. These would be an evidence of what they have done in class.

Summative Assessment: Summative assessment is aimed at judging levels of attainment of the learners. We conduct two Summative Assessments in a year, one in September and the other in February/ March. Summative and formative assessments are, therefore, inherently linked and teachers use their knowledge and practices to help students improve their performance.

Progress cards are given after each Summative Assessment with extensive remarks for subject skills.

For Classes Nursery to V: The school will follow a system of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation .A Holistic Progress card will be prepared comprising of three sections - Unit Based Assessment, Subject specific assessment and General Reflections. Four assessments will be conducted throughout the year based on Trans disciplinary Theme, Language , Visual and Performing Arts, Numeracy, Physical Education and individual reflections.

The skills tested will be Social Skills, Life Skills, Literacy Skills, Self-Management and Discipline focus. The Competencies mapped will be Critical Thinking/Problem Solving, Oral Communications, Team work and Collaboration, Character Building and Citizenship. The Holistic Progress card will be shared with the parents after every assessment.



Four assessments will be conducted throughout the year based on Trans disciplinary Theme, Language, Visual and Performing Arts, Numeracy, Physical Education, and individual reflections. The skills tested will be Social Skills, Life Skills, Literacy Skills, Self-Management and Discipline focus. The Competencies mapped will be Critical Thinking/ Problem Solving, Oral Communications, Team work and Collaboration, Character Building and Citizenship. The Holistic Progress card will be shared with the parents after every term assessment.

For Classes VI to VIII

- 1. The syllabus for annual examination will include topic/unit from the first half of the year. The topics will be informed accordingly.
- 2. Answer scripts from Summative Assessments (Half-Yearly and Annual Examinations) will be accessible exclusively during designated open house days, with no option for viewing after the results have been announced.

For Classes IX & X:

Secondary Curriculum provides students with a broad and balanced understanding of subjects including languages, Mathematics, Science, and Social Science to enable students to communicate effectively, analyse and interpret information meaningfully, make informed decisions, construct their worldview in alignment with constitutional values, and progress smoothly to be productive future citizens. The recent focus of CBSE is on developing 21st-century skills in settings where each student feels independent, safe, and comfortable with learning.

- The school has a provision for Enrichment/Remedial classes for students on working saturdays in order to encourage them to strengthen their scholastic areas.
- 2. Parents are requested to read the contents of the School Almanac carefully and in the interest of the child, abide by the rules and regulations laid down by the school. Kindly check your ward's almanac daily.
- 3. Whenever you correspond with the school about your son/ daughter, kindly quote his/her full name, class and section. All communications should be addressed to the Principal. Parents are requested to inform the school immediately if there is any change in address or telephone number.
- Parents should carry out their responsibilities as joint educators in instilling in their children respect and strict obedience for all school rules and regulations.
- Parents are requested to drop their ward latest by 7:40 am. School gates will be closed at 8:40 am. Regular late comers will be sent back home.
- Students should always wear their school I- Card and proper school uniform. Regular defaulters will be sent back home.
- Parents are requested to send all the required material asked by the school in the morning with their ward. Phone calls during the school hours will not be entertained.
- Kindly ensure that your ward carries school books, exercise books according to the time table for that day.
- 9. Apart from the training given by the school, students are expected to devote some time regularly at home. Supervision of the same should be arranged. Any problem relating to home work should be recorded in the note books/ school almanac by the parents.
- 10. Parents are requested to fix important appointments such as, with the doctor of their ward after school hours or on holidays.

- 11. School organizes lunch on payment on all working Fridays for the students, which is optional. Interested parents may kindly send a written consent to the class teacher.
- 12. No student will be allowed to leave the school premises before the school gets over, unless permission is granted in writing by the Principal.
- 13. At the time of dispersal, the parents of non-bus users are requested to come at 2:30 pm from Mon. to Fri.
- 14. The school has a system of fruit break in the Junior School. You are requested to ensure that the child carries at least one fruit every day.
- 15. Every student is expected to maintain an attendance record of at least 90% during the academic year, failing which he/she may not be allowed to appear in the Final Examination in March.
- 16. Please do not give mobile phone to your child. If any student is found carrying a mobile phone, it will be confiscated and a heavy fine will be imposed. (Refer to CBSE circular No. DE.23[555] sch.Br./2014/1900 dated 03/11/16)
- 17. Parents are requested to put their mobile phones on silent mode as soon as they enter the school premises.
- 18. Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
- 19. Parents who make independent transport arrangements for their ward by hiring private vehicles will be fully responsible for the same. They must ensure that proper verification of drivers is done and all safety measures are taken to avoid any untoward incident.

Guideline for Parents & PTM Schedule

- 20. The facility of internet is required by the students to do their homework and project work. As a parent, you are required to monitor the usage of internet by your ward so that he/ she does not misuse the internet access. It is advisable to route your child's E-mail through your account and share their password. Also, keep the computer in a central family location, not in the child's room. The usage of computer should be a family activity.
- 21. Parents are requested to sign the reports, test papers, teacher's remarks in the note books and school almanac and other similar documents so that they may keep in close touch with the progress of their child. Parents are also expected to visit the teachers whenever called, requested or on PTM's.
- 22. Regular meetings give an opportunity to the parents and teachers to discuss the progress of the child. It is also compulsory for the parents to meet the class teacher on the result declaration day.
- 23. Please do not send your child to school if he/she is feeling unwell. A proper leave application must be submitted in writing by the parents to the Principal in case of absence. This should be supported by a medical certificate in case of sick leave for more than three consecutive days.
- 24. Criticism of a teacher of the school in the presence of a child must be scrupulously avoided as it causes students to lose respect for their teacher with the consequent failure to learn from her, thus retarding the child's progress.
- 25. If you would like to celebrate the birthday of your ward, you are requested to send only toffees/eclairs to be distributed as a gesture in the class. It would be a good gesture to contribute one book to the school library on your child's birthday.
 Parents are requested to send the child in the school uniform.
- 26. As the medium of instruction in this school is English, students should be helped with regular English conversation practice at home so that they could keep pace with the class.
- 27. Plan future education of your ward(s) beyond the school in good time, so that they may be eligible to compete for admission to the maximum number of institutions for higher education.

Internet Policy

- 3) Students should restrict themselves from sending or posting information that is defamatory to the institution and to the members of the school fraternity.
- 4) Students should refrain from introducing malicious software onto the network of the institution and /or jeopardizing the security of the organization's electronic communication systems.

Parents:

All parents are required to acknowledge receipt and confirm that they have understood the above contents, are in agreement with the above policy and undertake to ensure that their child / children abide by the rules stated above.

Student Compliance:

Students are hereby directed to abide by the Internet Usage Policy as stated above & understand that they are liable for suspension or expulsion from the school should they violate any of the provisions of this policy.

Policy on Electronic Gadgets

- As per CBSE guidelines, students are not permitted to carry mobile phones, Laptops, I pads, I stations, PSPs, cameras or any other electronic gadgets to school.
- Should any such gadgets be found with the students on the school campus or in the bus, the same will be confiscated and no requests for returning of the same will be entertained.
- Students violating this regulation will be liable for suspension from the school.

Mode of Fee Payment and International Admissions

IMPORTANT

- The School fees and other charges are payable as per the fee invoices generated and forwarded on the primary Email IDs of the parents directly through ERP.
- 2. If the last date for payment of fee happens to be a holiday, the preceding day (not the following day) shall be taken as the last date.

FEE PAYMENT

- 1. Online Fee payment can be made through ERP portal Edu Next under the fee tab of the student. The due date to pay is 10th of first month of each quarter i.e. April, July, October and January.
- 2. Fee can be paid by offline mode at school Accounts desk on working days between 8:00 to 15:00 hours.
- 3. Fee can also be paid by cheque in favour of "K. R. MANGALAM WORLD SCHOOL" and should be dropped in the Drop Box located at the School Gate No.1. Please mention Student Name, Class, Admission Number and your contact number at the back of the cheque for proper processing. Any Post-dated/corrected/over written or mutilated cheques will not be accepted.

FINE

- Dishonoured Cheques: In case of a cheque issued towards any
 payment due to the school is dishonoured on its presentation to the
 bank for insufficient funds or any other reason, a penalty of Rs. 500
 will be charged.
- Late Fee Fine: Any delay in payment of fees after the due date will invite late fee fine. It may also lead to the student's name being struck off the rolls.
- 3. **Re-Admission**: Re-admission will be allowed only after payment of outstanding dues by Demand Draft only including late fee fine and the prescribed re-admission fee /charge.

RULES REGARDING WITHDRAWALS

- If a student wishes to withdraw from the school, the transfer certificate
 will be issued on one month's written notice by the parent or payment of
 one month's fee in lieu thereof. Additionally, the due date for accounting
 each month is the 10th. Admission fee will not be refunded in any case.
- If a student is absent without any reason for more than 6 days, his/her name may be struck off the school rolls as per Delhi School Education Rules.
- For withdrawal from any facility, such as, School Transport or the Midday meal, parents must submit a written notice at least one month in advance by the 10th of the month/ or else pay one month fee in lieu of notice.
- 3. Withdrawal of transport facility is not permitted in the last Quarter of the session.

INTERNATIONAL ADMISSIONS

Medical Guidance



All parents are requested to impart health education to their children.

- a. Maintain personal hygiene and cleanliness. (trimming of nails, regular hair cut etc.)
- b. Ensure that they sleep eight hours a day.
- c. Ensure they exercise daily.
- d. Have a balanced diet, nutritionally rich in proteins and milk
- e. Drink water which is either boiled or filtered. All students are advised to bring their own water bottles from home.
- f. Avoid consumption of ice-creams, other milk products and eatables from road-side vendors.
- g. De-worm all children at least once every year-advice to be taken from their family physician.

Get a dental and an ophthalmic check up done once every year.

A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a doctor's certificate of fitness permitting him/her to attend the school.

Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class.

Whooping cough	Six weeks	Jaundice	Six weeks

Students are not allowed to enter the medical room without his / her almanac.

Students suffering from infectious diseases like Conjunctivitis, Dermatitis, Scabies, etc. should not be sent to school.

Students suffering from chronic diseases like Asthma, Epilepsy, Rheumatic Heart Disease, etc. are advised to be under continuous medical supervision of a Specialist Doctor. History of their illness must be filled up in the KRM Almanac along with the details of treatment being taken.
